Reaching and teaching troubled children



▼ Aims Of The Course

To deepen understanding of the emotional factors which affect children's learning and their confidence in making relationships in educational settings. To draw on this insight to help children in school.

To develop therapeutic teaching skills in working with children with emotional, behavioural and learning difficulties.

To introduce educational psychotherapy concepts and approaches in working with and supporting troubled children.

▼ Course Content

The course includes a work discussion group each week and a programme of seminars. The first part of the evening is a work discussion group which is an opportunity for group members to reflect on their own experiences in working with children. The discussion is facilitated by an educational psychotherapist.

The programme of seminars is taught by educational psychotherapists and other experienced professionals.



▼ Seminar Programme

Term 1

Beginnings, Transitions and Endings

- understanding and responding to the deep feelings which may be aroused at times of change.

Attachment and Learning

- exploring patterns of attachment and how these affect children's learning and relationships in school.

Loss and the Family

- ways in which loss impacts on learning, with particular emphasis on children's difficulties in reading and numeracy.

Making it Possible for Children to Learn to Read

- understanding resistance to reading and writing.
- Engaging children through practical approaches.

Term 2

Teachers' Responses to Cultural and Racial Diversity in School

- understanding the importance of a sense of self and identity within a group.

How we Make Sense of Children's Difficult Behaviour in School

- the use of curriculum and classroom strategies to help children manage their feelings.

Working Therapeutically with Groups in School

- exploring and expressing feelings within a safe group and focusing on peer relationships.

Supporting Children in School Through Mentoring and Counselling

- the value of a different kind of relationship with an adult in school. Making an alliance with teachers.

▼ The London Course

The seminars are held at Caspari House, 1 Noel Road, London N1 8HQ on Thursday evenings 6.15 to 9.00 pm. The course runs in the Autumn and Spring Terms.

▼ The Brighton Course

The seminars are held in a central location in Brighton, on Monday evenings 6.15 to 9.00 pm. The course runs in the Autumn and Spring Terms. Please contact Heather Royce (01273 701219) for details.

▼ Who Should Apply?

Practitioners working with troubled children in educational settings, including teachers, learning mentors, psychologists, classroom assistants, speech therapists, social workers and counsellors.

▼ Time Commitment

The course lasts two terms and is held one evening a week for 10 weeks each term. No written work is required apart from contributions to the work discussions. A certificate is awarded for those who have attended 80% of the course.

▼ Fees

The cost of the course is £450. This may be paid termly (two payments of £225). Please complete application form overleaf.
